Another GREAT Christmas Parade

On December 7th the Broadmoor Residents' Association hosted its sixth annual Christmas parade. Due to the success of the LSU Tigers, we ran into a conflict on the timing of our parade. The SEC Championship game is always held at 3:00 PM on the first Saturday in December and our parade is always at 2:00 PM the same day and normally would finish at 3:30 PM. We noticed that the number of participating groups was lower than normal and we had a couple of groups cancel because of the timing. Eight days before the parade we had 23 groups and normally our parade has about 45 groups participate. So, on Monday before the parade we got city approval to move our start time up to 1:15 PM which means it should finish no later than 2:45 PM.

This timing change caused some understandable frustration and extra work for some folks. But, in the end it was a good move. The week of the parade we increased the number of units to 35 with almost 600 people participating in the parade. As it turned out the parade ended at 2:25 PM which gave everyone time to get home for the start of the game.

We have tentative approval from the police department to have a 12:30 PM start time in the future. This should help reduce future conflicts because of the game.

Numerous comments made on social media gave the parade a lot of praise. If all goes well, we will be able to have the seventh Christmas parade on **December 5th**, **2020**. Put it on your calendar, and maybe you too will be able to participate in the annual Christmas parade.

Office of Neighborhoods

Did you know that Baton Rouge has an Office of Neighborhoods? According to the city of Baton Rouge's website, the office "functions as the voice of neighborhoods within City-Parish government." The office communicates "with individuals, neighborhoods and civic associations, lead(s) dialogues about the problems they face, and work(s) together with the rest of City-Parish government to find solutions." Some of the solutions residents are in search of can be found by contacting the 3-1-1 hotline. The hotline is available five days a week and call center staff can assist residents with everything from domestic animal issues and potholes to tree hazards and mosquito concerns. There are also answers to many common questions on the Office of Neighborhoods' webpage. Questions such as What can be done to stop chronic speeders on neighborhood streets? and How does single family zoning affect my property? are addressed at https://www.brla.gov/666/Neighborhood-Issues.

Digital City Honors

As we move into a new decade that promises innovation and advancements in technology, the city of Baton Rouge is celebrating a top 10 ranking as a digital city. According to a press release from the mayor's office, the Center for Digital Government ranked Baton Rouge fifth among mid-sized U.S. cities. This is the fifth year in a row that Baton Rouge has been named a top digital city. The Center for Digital Government has conducted the annual Digital Cities Survey to measure cities' performance and innovation in using technology for nearly twenty years the release states. The organization describes itself as "a national research and advisory institute on information technology policies and best practices in state and local government." Other cities making the top 10 list include Norfolk, Virginia; Cape Coral, Florida; Bellevue, Washington; Alexandria, Virginia and Pasadena, California.
