Summer Safety Tips from the BCPID

Summer is here!! And with summer comes different challenges in keeping our neighborhood safe.

One of those challenges is that many children are out of school and will be home alone - some for the first time. Experts recommend installing a smart home camera and smart doorbell camera to keep an eye on the safety of those home alone. They also recommend that your child know the following:

- Information that 911 would need to know if called;
- The nearest cross streets; and
- Trusted neighbors and friends to reach out to in case of an emergency

Another challenge is that we leave our homes empty while on vacation. Some of the things we can do to protect our home while we are away are:

- Ask someone to watch your home;
- Put your mail on hold;
- Don't announce your absence on social media;
- Don't let newspapers or packages pile up;
- Leave curtains and lights like you normally have them; and
- Alert your alarm company

While our neighborhood children are great and our crime is minimal, Broadmoor Crime Prevention and Improvement District (BCPID) believes it is important to continue to be proactive in crime prevention. Because of this, every summer BCPID increases the hours of our Private Police Patrol (PPP), and we have done so again this year.

BCPID's primary focus is crime prevention and BCPID's PPP currently employs ten Baton Rouge City Police (including a police coordinator). They patrol, in both marked and unmarked vehicles seven days a week at varying hours. Because of the hard work of the PPP, our neighborhood's crime rate continues to be one of the lowest, per capita, in Baton Rouge and they work hard to keep it that way. As always, residents should call 911 when they have an emergency.

Remember all BCPID's meetings are public meetings and subject to public meeting rules and disclosures. The meetings are held at the Broadmoor United Methodist Church – Adult Education Building, corner of Sharp Road and Mollylea Drive.

8th Annual Broadmoor Christmas Parade

You are invited to participate in the parade or just be a spectator on Saturday, December 3rd at 11:00 am. The time change is to avoid conflicts with the annual SEC football championship, and the Baton Rouge Police Department has requested this start time. The football championship always starts at 3:00 pm. By starting at 11:00 am, our parade will be completely finished by 12:30 pm, thus giving everyone ample time to get to their favorite game-watching spot before the kickoff.

As usual, the parade starts and ends at the high school parking lot. The parade route is 1.9 miles long and is as follows: (1) east on Goodwood Boulevard; (2) north on Woodhaven Street; (3) west on South River Oaks; (4) south on Cora Drive; (5) east on Goodwood Boulevard to the high school.

Nearly any kind of entry is acceptable; however, no animals/pets are permitted due to insurance requirements.

Spectators and participants are asked to bring a non-perishable food item, which will be donated to a food bank immediately after the parade. The last entry in the parade is the food donation collection, so have your non-perishable food items ready as they come by to collect.
